7pm: common prayer at Ahoy

Friday 31 December 2010

Around 1pm: meetings by country or region
4.30pm: common prayer at Ahoy
Around 7pm: festive meal with guest family
11pm: prayer vigil for peace in the host parishes, followed by the "Festival of Nations"
